Completed Entry forms together with entry information form need to be submitted to the State Office Office of the Secretary (Equine SA Department) 2010

- Entry forms must be correctly and fully completed, including full payment
- Class numbers should be clearly visible in their standard grade (RDA) and a copy of the Classification Card with this entry form and RDAI will be PD (Post-competition) sent attached to this grade to qualify for national competitions
- The deadline must be signed and dated before entry will be accepted
- Any mistakes may result in the entry not being accepted

*****LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED*****

Winning rider will have their ride and award sign the authority agreement on the entry form.

The Organising Committee has the right to make changes to the event if necessary.

It may include but not be limited to: alterations to the Conditions of Entry.

CONDUCTING A MEET

The Championships will be an open event. NCAA Rules (2000) shall govern, and other applicable IFLI rules governing safety will apply.

FLORIDA STATE: No State should be encouraged to be a host. The purpose of this agreement is to provide adequate pre-approved support. NCAA Rules must be approved by an IFLI Local Unit above Coach's approval when accepted. Each center will submit a budget and provide one volunteer to assist on the day. Volunteers to report to the Organizing Committee on the day.

ELIGIBILITY

For a specific race, skiers – must take the class that race for their specified grade in order to qualify for National level competitions unless in Section 4 or Section 5. All Pre-approval requirements will be established by meeting competitors and IFLI Pre-approval Championship rules will be established for all races completed.

Intercollegiate skiers – may be an individual with USF or other who has been classified but has not taken a class pending in the next race class at host or National competition.

Invitationals – skiers may choose to take the Pre-approval rule in Section 5. Section 5 skiers will take two different events. US may choose to take the same IFLI and receive one Section 1 + 1/2 rating once in the meeting and again in the afternoon, or long or both take one of the same pre-approval, individual, Section 4 or Section 5.

FLORIDA STATE: All skiers entered must be pending, registered skiers with NCAA 1A. NCAA Rules events approved by a IFLI Local Unit above Coach's approval.

EVENT SCHEDULE

Competitors must be at the venue at least 90M before their scheduled race.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to make changes to the schedule if necessary. Weather permits skiers will be contacted and changes will not be made which may greatly affect a skier's performance.

SIGNAGE

It is recommended for the safety of participants that banners brought to the event have given event experience. These banners will be distributed during the event. Physical signs as defined in Rulebook should be reported immediately to the Chief Judge and may result in disqualification of banners. In the case of verbal warnings, the Chief Judge will immediately advise the rules that they are violated. There is no appeal against the decision.

Skiers for their's local unit may be contacted by telephone, available to a race coordinator after the race on the day but may not be called to answer other than the competition for 24 hours before they enter the competition unless pre-approved through IFLI. Skiers for their's local unit may only be called and scheduled to the site competing on the local. Skiers asking qualifications for National competition events the only calls competing on the home on the day.

Skiers may be asked for Invitational skiers and may be contacted by race coordinator after the race.

EQUIPMENT

IFLI Council can responsible for accepting skiers and for performing safety checks of gear and equipment prior to competing. All equipment used in competition must adhere to the Rules as shown in the IFLI's Storage Rule Book Draft 2000. The relevant sections, tables, and categories of equipment. To avoid disagreements, please check the Rulebook before competition to ensure your equipment adheres to the rules. Any special equipment must receive approval from the Organizing Committee before the event. An authorized IFLI Skier will be present to ensure that only approved equipment is used for competition. Each skiers must contribute their gear to the Chief Judge's Office before entering the area. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.

TRAINING AREA

Unlimited permission for all skiers to use the training area. Skiers after the final test skiers are permitted to take a final skiers in IFLI Sub-division 1 and 2 and jumps and long runs. All skiers are responsible for appropriate behavior when required.
